PRIZEGIVING: Once all races are finished and results are available.

ENTRIES: Entries close on 9th January 2026, at 12:00 noon . Late entries can be made on the day subject to the MAXIMUM of 60 boats not being exceeded. Please check for availability of late entries before travelling.

Entry Fee: £10 per person (£5 classic, £5 sprint).

Please enter and pay using the Wild Water Racing Entry system.

HAZARDS: Care should be taken around rowers, fishermen and other river users. All paddlers should be aware of oncoming paddlers and keep to the left of the river even though the Trent is quite wide. This is especially important after the start for paddlers moving down the river as others may be paddling up on the racing line.

SAFETY: Canoeing and Kayaking is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. An entry into the event has taken this into consideration.

All paddlers in must wear buoyancy aids.

All boats must have buoyancy that is sufficient to keep the boat and paddlers afloat in the event of a capsize.

RULES: The race will be run in accordance with the current Wild Water Racing rules.

PRIZES: For all classes depending on entry.

NOTE: Burton Phoenix Canoe Club reserves the right without prior notice to alter any of these arrangements should the weather or other circumstances warrant.
