



GRANDTULLY WWR– 18/19th July 2026

SPRINT: - Saturday 18th July 2026
CLASSIC: - Sunday 19th July 2026
VENUE: - River Tay, Grandtully. River Grade 3 (4 in Flood)
River level: - [SCA Where's the Water](#)

N.B. This event is a GB Selection Event for Junior/U23 European Championships

Sprint event - Saturday 18th July - River Tay, Grandtully rapids

Get on: Walk approximately 100m up the footpath beside the river at Grandtully Rapids.
Sprint Start: Eddy, north side of river (river left), above main Grandtully fall (just above the gabion slalom start position).
Sprint Finish: Below Bottom fall, finish line will be as close the last waves on the fall as possible.

Classic event - Sunday 19th July - River Tay, from Edradynate to Grandtully

Pre-start: Get on at Aberfeldy Slalom Course by the cemetery/Beyond Adventure
Classic Start: North side of the river at Edradynate
Classic Finish: Below Bottom fall, finish line will be as close the last waves on the fall as possible.

ENTRIES AND PAYMENTS

All entries and payments to be made via the Wild Water Racing UK Website online entry system. Those who are not individual members of national associations (PS, PUK, PW, CANI) will be required to take out PS event day membership in addition to the entry fee.

RACE CONTROL

Race control throughout the weekend will be in the carpark outside Grandtully Campsite offices. All competitors will be issued with a numbered race bib before racing. This must be worn by the competitor to which it is issued at all times whilst on the water over the weekend. Competitor will keep the same bib for both days of racing.

All bibs will be collected immediately after racing on Sunday.

Registration and race number bib collection will be open at the following times at Grandtully Station Park:

- Saturday – 10:00-11:00 bib collection. Briefing will be provided when collecting your bib
- Sunday – Return bib immediately after your run

PROVISIONAL TIMETABLE

More specific information regarding start times will be provided once entries have closed and the split of paddlers into different classes has been determined. Planned times are as follows.

* There is a pre-start paddle on Sunday for the Classic event. It takes around 20-25 minutes to reach the Classic start - depending on craft, river flow etc.

** Times are provisional and adjustments will be made to allow time for those competing on more than one class.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The event will be run according to Paddle UK Wild Water Racing rules.

RESULTS

Live timing will be available at <https://results.carlweb.co.uk/racecontrol/> Results will be made available as soon as possible after each event and will be printed and in the window of Paddle Scotland HQ on the campsite.

Prize giving will take place at Grandtully Campsite Carpark as soon as the results have been compiled and verified on each individual day of competition.

FISHING AND CODE OF CONDUCT

The Tay is popular for salmon fishing and this race is within the fishing season. If you do encounter a fisher, please try and avoid fishing lines and, as always, be polite and courteous – we are expected to follow the Paddlers Code of Conduct: <https://paddlerscode.info/#respect>

Please take time to familiarise yourselves with the code of conduct, particularly Respect and Protect, as access to the River Tay to run competitions would not be possible without the favour of local fishers and landowners.

PARKING AND ACCESS

Sprint Parking

Everyone should park at Grandtully Campsite, Grandtully, by Pitlochry, PH9 0PL, or in the Quarry just above the carpark – there will be signs directing paddlers to appropriate parking.

Parking for Classic events -

Parking at Pre-Start - at Aberfeldy Slalom Course, Riverside, Aberfeldy, PH15 2EB

Parking at Finish - Grandtully Campsite, Grandtully, by Pitlochry, PH9 0PL

PLEASE DO NOT PARK ANYWHERE WITHIN GRANDTULLY VILLAGE, OR AT THE CLASSIC GET OUT POINT DURING RACING

BOATS SHOULD ONLY BE LEFT AT THE FOLLOWING AREAS:

- Aberfeldy slalom site/Beyond adventure
- Grandtully station car park (not taking up parking spaces)
- Along the river bank, the length of the slalom course
- DO NOT LEAVE BOATS ON THE SIDE OF THE ROAD THROUGH THE VILLAGE

TOILETS / CHANGING FACILITIES / DISABILITY ACCESS

Grandtully Campsite facilities will be available for all competitors and team staff free of charge for the duration of racing.

ACCOMMODATION

The PS Grandtully Station Campsite is an ideal location. To book camping at the Grandtully Station Campsite please do so via the PS website. There are lots of other accommodation options available in the area too.

[Grandtully Hotel](#) is open daily and has a restaurant and bar serving food and drinks

[Highland Chocolatier](#) is open daily 10am-5pm serving coffees, teas and snacks in its cafe

[COOP](#) in Aberfeldy is open till 10pm each day. There is also a petrol station.
